My investigation examines the role of the Latvian Evangelical Lutheran Church in shaping Latvia's political debates, revealing diverse opinions within the church about its influence on public policy. While some members actively oppose specific engagements and others prefer to avoid polarising issues, the church continues to assert itself as a moral compass in society. Drawing on Rosa's theories of public discourse and resonance, this study frames the church as a forum for deep, meaningful engagement with faith and society, suggesting that resonant experiences within the church can contribute to individual and communal well-being.

Analysis of interviews reveals the church's ongoing struggle to maintain its values in a modern, secular world, where tensions between individual and institutional beliefs emerge. These findings highlight the church's quest for relevance and resonance amidst the complexities of contemporary societal discourse. I seek to explore the intersections of neoconservatism, liberalism, and religion, offering a platform for discussing how these forces shape our collective future. We invite participants to reflect on how religious influences and contrasting values continue to mould societal dynamics.

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
